### **Our Policy**

The Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. uses its best efforts to respect the privacy of its online visitors. At our site, we do not collect personally identifiable information from individuals unless they provide it to us voluntarily and knowingly. This means we do not require you to register or provide information to us in order to view our site. The Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. only gathers personally identifiable data, such as name, addresses, zip/postal codes, e-mail addresses, etc., when voluntarily submitted by a visitor. For example, personally identifiable information may be collected in order to make a financial donation online. This information is used solely by the Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. or other entities involved in the operation of this site for internal purposes. Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. lists are never sold to third parties.

We will only share personally identifiable information with third parties when:

- the person submitting the information authorizes us to share it
- sharing the information is a necessary operation of the site, for instance, to process a credit card transaction
- we are required to by law

Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. has no control over or responsibility for the data collection and use practices of third parties that process online donation credit card transactions.

### **How Do We Use Cookies?**

Visitors should be aware that non-personal information and data may be automatically collected by the Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. website through the use of "cookies." Cookies are small text files a website can use to recognize repeat visitors, facilitate the visitor's ongoing access to and use of the site, and allow a site to track usage behavior and compile aggregate data that will allow content improvements. Cookies are not programs that come onto a visitor's system and damage files. Generally, cookies work by assigning a unique number to the visitor that has no meaning outside the assigning site. If a visitor does not want information collected through the use of cookies, there is a simple procedure in most browsers that allows the visitor to deny or accept the cookie feature. Ackerman Institute for the Family, Inc. uses "cookie" technology only to obtain non-personal information from its online visitors in order to improve visitors' online experience and facilitate their visit within our site.
